College Applications - Be in the Know

Stop by the Guidance Office to make an appointment to meet with your counselor to get started on this sometimes overwhelming process. The sooner you begin, the less overwhelming it will be.

- Fact 1** You will get to know the Counselor's office and its college library very well. Come in and review information about the college admission process and different school application requirements.
- Fact 2** **DEADLINES will get you if you aren't careful** - deadlines for college applications, for scholarship applications, for financial aid applications, for ACT and SAT registration. Pay close attention to your deadlines and to Franklin's internal deadlines. **REMEMBER, it takes four weeks (20 school days) for the Guidance Office to prepare and mail your recommendation and/or transcript.**
- Fact 3** **While the bulk of this process will require a great deal of effort on your part**, you will work closely with us, either Ms. DeGrazio (last names beginning with M – Z) or Ms. Flair (A – L). Come get to know us because we will write your counselor letters of recommendations. We will be offering a weekly or bi-monthly College Bulletin to keep you posted on College Visitors, test registration deadlines, scholarship opportunities and more. It is YOUR responsibility to read the Bulletins, to check the Junior/Senior Bulletin Board on the second floor just outside of our office, to meet with your counselor, to meet with college reps as they visit Franklin's campus. In short, the process is your responsibility and we will do everything in our power to make it as easy as possible.
- Fact 4** **The clock is running** - so start the application process NOW. Last year, you learned about the *College Admissions Handbook* full of great information on helping you to narrow your options and select the colleges and/or universities to which you will apply. **Read it NOW (click here)**. Review the *Handbook* with regard to all that is required to acquire letters of recommendation from your teachers and from your College Counselors. See page 6-1 of the *College Admissions Handbook* to see what is required before we can write your letters of recommendation.
- Fact 5** **If you haven't taken the SAT, Subject Tests, and/or the ACT, DON'T FORGET TO REGISTER FOR THE OCTOBER test dates.** Register online at www.collegeboard.com and www.act.org. The deadline for the October 14th SAT (or Subject Tests) is September 12. The deadline for the October 28th ACT is September 22nd. Don't forget to send your test scores to Franklin, school code: 192006.

IF THERE IS ANY CHANCE YOU WILL LIVE IN THE DORM, YOU MUST APPLY FOR HOUSING NOW! Applying to **other large state schools?** Apply for housing as soon as you can.

Try the FAFSA4caster on the FAFSA website: <https://fafsa.ed.gov/FAFSA/app/f4cForm?execution=e1s1>. This site will give you an idea of where your family stands for financial aid. What you will learn is an ESTIMATE of your EFC (Expected Family Contribution). This financial aid calculator will give you a good estimate for schools that do not require the CSS Profile.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Every senior should have started an online scholarship search. Use www.finaid.com, www.fastweb.com, www.collegeanswer.com or any of the many free online searches available.

******Important: If you are nominated for a particular scholarship program, please realize that this is a great honor and that BFHS considers you their best candidate for success... however, recognize that a nomination is not a guarantee that you will receive that scholarship. Most require interviews, etc. and are very competitive with students from across the country. Be sure to prepare for your best work, and best of luck. ******

University of North Carolina Chapel Hill – The Morehead-CAIN Scholarship recognizes well-rounded young leaders who set a **high standard** for the rest: in conduct and in achievement, in the classroom and in extracurriculars. Morehead nominees must demonstrate capacities to lead and to motivate fellow students, scholastic ability and extracurricular attainments, moral force of character, and physical vigor. If you are interested in being considered for Franklin's one nomination, see Ms. DeGrazio or Ms. Flair by August 31, 2011.

The University of Virginia's Jefferson Scholars program seeks to attract the most promising students in the country, those who possess exceptional ability in leadership and scholarship and who show promise of making a significant contribution to the University community as students and to society at large. Seniors who are interested in being considered for Franklin's one nomination for this outstanding scholarship opportunity must sign up in the Guidance Office by October 1st.
